Best Bitter

A traditional Best Bitter brewed with Pale and Crystal malts and Goldings aroma hops. The result is a full-bodied ale with distinctive fruity caramel notes. Ideal with pork dishes & cheese

Golden Ale

English Pale malts coupled with Challenger and Goldings hops provide the bitterness and aroma. The result is a highly distinctive light, golden ale similar in character to a full-bodied Czech lager. Serve chilled for maximum enjoyment. A classic fish & chip beer, this goes well with all manner of fresh fish

Suffolk Ale

Suffolk-grown First Gold hops provide the inspiration for this well hopped premium beer which is brewed with Suffolk malt to produce a full bodied bitter ale with a lasting hop aroma.

Ruby Red

A tawny red ale with subtle malt undertones and a distinctive spicy hop aroma from Styrian Goldings. Ruby Red Ale won a Silver Medal at the SIBA East Anglian Beer Festival in Bedford in October 2004. Serve lightly chilled or at room temperature. Beautifully complements Barnards beef and game dishes

Organic Ale

Water is extracted from a 300' deep borehole and combined with Soil Association accredited light malted barley from Norfolk. Organic Hallertau hops from New Zealand provide the distinctive palate. The yeast used is St. Peter's own single strand variety. The result is a delicate, clean, crisp, lightly carbonated, traditional English ale with a full "citrus hop" aftertaste. This lovely beer won the Soil Association's top prize in 2002. Complex ale, goes well with fresh fish and many vegetarian dishes

Honey Porter

A traditional English porter finished with honey for a truly unique aroma and taste. This is a famous old ale which has been handed down through generations. Pure honey on the nose, goes well with creamy soups and custard based desserts

Cream Stout

"Fuggles" and "Challenger" hops plus a blend of 4 local barley malts create an aromatic, strong, dark chocolate cream stout with a satisfying bittersweet aftertaste. Gold Medal winner in the International Beer Competition in 2003 and 2004. Best with shellfish...or chocolate!
